Dear Parents:

Welcome to this week's edition of The Full Curl. This week's edition will feature some important thoughts I have on the idea of Presupposition. However, if you aren't interested in this aspect of the column, please scroll down to read the various blurbs on school related items.

I am a relationships guy. As a coach, I always believed my success hinged on relationships. However, as I grew as a person, I found the power of relationships to go far beyond the basketball court. My basketball camp business grew through strong relationships. I found in a classroom, I was more effective if I grew the relationships with my students, just as I had done on the court. The bottom line? Everything is about relationships.

There are many components that must be present for a relationship to be strong. Two of those are trust and communication. One of the guiding principles, suggested by St. Ignatius, to help facilitate effective communication is the concept of Presupposition. St. Ignatius had this to say about Presupposition:

We should all endeavor to interpret positively all conversations, to correct with love and search out appropriately all means through which to understand in a good way.

As Director of Schools, it is my intent to use this approach to grow my relationship with each of you. Communication must be at the forefront of this position. I will make every attempt to keep you updated as we walk together on this long, winding, joyful journey. My goal as a coach has always been to over-communicate and while this job is a big one, my hope is to never let the job get in the way of my ability to share my thoughts with you, and more importantly to me, to hear you.

As a demonstration of my desire to build strong, lasting relationships, **I am excited to talk with parents tomorrow at 6pm in the Chapel.** I'm still working on my outline for the night, so if you want me to address or speak to anything in particular, please feel free to reach out.
